# Attention K-Mart Shoppers

As a child I remember that new store opening up across town; it had almost everything a person could want under one roof! It was an event when the family all went shopping at K-Mart, Mom could look at clothes, dad could browse the hardware section, and all the while we kids were amply entertained in the toy section. Periodically we would hear the sound system interrupt with the exciting announcement, "Attention K-Mart shoppers, we have a blue-light special going on in ..." some section of the store. They certainly had our attention.

In Amos chapter 4 God is holding His own blue-light special. He is telling the Israelites all the ways He has tried to get their attention. God mentions that He caused hunger in every city. He withheld the rain before the crops were ready. The Lord struck the gardens and vineyards with blight and mildew. Many times, He sent locust to devour. God sent plagues, killed the young men in war. Horses were captured.

Cities were overthrown. And each time a calamity is mentioned Amos writes, "yet you have not returned to Me," declares the Lord."

The people thought they were doing all the right things because they were bringing their sacrifices, tithes, and offerings. They assumed all these calamities were just the way things go with nature and in life. Yet through the prophets and all these events,

God was just trying to get their attention.

Towards the end of this chapter is the verse that probably inspired the phrase, "prepare to meet your maker." God is letting them know that if they aren't going to return to Him after all these attention getters, they better prepare after hearing His warnings through the prophet Amos. The chapter ends with the declaration that through the trials which, come


our way we will come to know that' "the Lord God Almighty is His name."

Isaiah 13:7 says, "Because of this, all hands will go limp, every heart will melt with fear." God allows things to happen in our lives that are designed to get our attention. There may be other reasons too, but even more than K-Mart, God wants our attention.

Is God still seeking our attention today? You don't have to look very far to see everything that is happening. Today, do we still just see these events as a part of life? Or is God trying to get our attention?

I'd like to focus for a bit on data from the financial markets and how they might be telling us that God is trying to get our attention. The graph below shows the last 30

> history vears the Volatility Index (ticker symbol VIX). The index is also commonly known as the "Fear Index". This index tracks the volatility in U.S. financial markets. When investors are afraid of not being able to make



money in the near future they panic and sell their stocks, creating volatility. When things are humming along nicely and investors are confident in their ability to make money, the index hovers in the 10-15 range.

The graph shows that, in roughly the first 20 years of the time-period shown, investors only reached a fear level of 40 or higher on 3 occasions. However, in roughly the last

# Pistant Learning in Idaho Adventist Schools: The Good, the Hard and the Odd Patrick Frey, Superintendent of Schools, Idaho Conference

The 2019-2020 School year has been one that a generation of students will not forget thanks to COVID-19. While most of the year was spent in classrooms, those days will not be the ones remembered. Instead it will be days under social distancing, a phrase most of us probably had not heard before.

It is easy to only focus on the negative events in 2020. But I want to share with you some of the good things that have come out the pandemic, as well some of the odd things and some hard things not mentioned.

One of the good things was that most of our schools were prepared for the shutdown and were online with in days the doors closed. Jessica Davidson, teacher at the Eagle Adventist School, commented, "we did not miss a single day of school because of this pandemic, and my students are still learning and working in the face of all the challenges." Boyde Hosey, head teacher of the Baker Adventist Christian School, had the students being taught and completing online assignments several weeks in the classroom before school shutdown. They took their books and desk items home the day school closed and were up and running the next day as if nothing had happened.

There were some challenges to be sure. Some students did not have a technology device to logon to the internet to attend classes. To solve this problem, many of schools sent home Chrome Books or iPads for students that needed them. Internet access was also a problem. "When we realized that three families didn't have internet," explained Bobi Crenshaw of the Hilltop Adventist School in Twin Falls, "a couple of board members got busy and helped figure it out." They were able to get free internet for one family, one family received funds to get online and the school provide a hotspot for the third.

As days rolled by, Ever Perez, Bible teacher and pastor at Gem State Adventist Academy, noticed some unusual behaviors in his students. He said, "I had a freshman who really didn't like having class at 8:00 a.m. so he would show up for class long enough for attendance and then would mysteriously disappear; never to be seen again that day.

"I had several that liked to eat during class, so all I would see for the first 30 minutes of class was food being shoveled into an open mouth followed by chewing, followed by shoveling, followed by chewing....

The freshmen were my most challenging class. I had kids

often show up wrapped in blankets, you could tell they had just opened their eyes because they weren't really open.

In several classes the Zoom view of my students could at times get very interesting. I had a sophomore who loved to walk around his house during class. He also preferred the up-nostril view while he walked around. Very disconcerting.

I also had several scalpers. They would set the camera so that all I could see was the very top of their heads. Enough to know they were there, but not enough to know what they were doing (which was clearly, not participating).

Then there were the "silhouette-ers." The students who would sit with a window or light behind them, making it impossible to see more than a silhouette. It was like a 45-minute shadow puppet show."

Bobi had "one child trying to focus in class while his baby brother is banging him on the head with a metal bowl. We've had dogs, a lot of cats and kittens, a baby quail, younger siblings, older siblings, parents and grandparents in our Zoom meetings."

There were also some cool things happening. Many teachers had parent volunteers help them with technology and other needs. One teacher made it to many of the students' 23 homes doing porch drop offs. Then students were driven by her house and would drop off treats for her such as crazy socks, yummy pastries and flowers. Now those are morale boosters!

There were also the challenges. Most of the teachers had to worked far longer hours per day doing Distance Learning teaching than teaching pre-COVID-19. Some children were having a hard time sleeping or were becoming depressed, many kids missed their classrooms and their friends. Not being in the classroom caused some students to lose motivation during the last weeks of school.

But through all this, every morning a great bunch of teachers turned on their computers, greeted their students and did their best to make learning interesting and meaningful for their students, no matter how tired they were or how long the day was. By the grace of God, they taught.

So, this summer thank the teachers that your children had.





10 years there have been 6 occasions where the fear level reached 40 or higher, with 2 of those hitting the 90 range.
